Banking Sector Stands to Benefit from Upcoming Interest Rate Hikes

Fund Features

- The Fund focuses on high yielding Asia Pacific bonds and equities, distributions from both bonds and equities are the main source of income.

Market Review and Outlook
Bonds

- 10-year U.S. Treasury yields rose sharply by around 20 basis points to 3.1% during the first half of May as a result of strong U.S. economic data and expectations of a further rate hike. However, the combined impact of Italian political worries and risk-off sentiment pushed the yield back down to a level of around 2.8% to 2.9%.
- Overall, Asian high yield bond markets continued to experience some correction in May due to risk-off sentiment and individual credit events of Chinese high yield industrial names.
- In terms of Asian investment grade bonds, long-dated and higher credit quality AA and A rated names have outperformed in May, due to lower U.S. Treasury yields and investors' flight for credit quality.

Equities

- Both onshore and offshore Chinese equity markets were up slightly in May. Fundamentals remained solid but market direction was still mixed due to swing factors such as trade tensions.
- The Taiwan market was boosted by a recovery in sentiment towards the Apple supply chain ahead of Apple's 2018 product launch, as well as decent April sales, encouraging first-quarter results, and a shortage in passive components.
- The Australian market enjoyed another strong month in May, led by the consumer discretionary and health care sectors. The former benefitted from strong reported earnings, while the latter was lifted by the positive profit outlook for a large-cap company.

Investment Strategy

Bonds

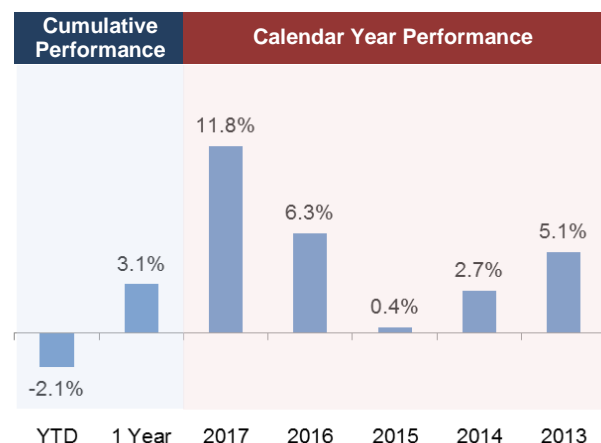
- The Fund remains defensive in May and continued to hold more defensive short-dated bonds and retained a higher level of cash in view of market volatility.

Equities

- The Fund took the opportunity to diversify its holdings as trade tensions increased market volatility. We remain positive about the banking sector, which stands to benefit from upcoming interest rate hikes. We are also positive on companies with a commitment to dividends backed by strong cash flows and balance sheets.
- The Fund shifted into high dividend energy stocks ahead of ex-dividend date, by reducing its exposure in Australian equities.
